Sarah Arison for her visionary philanthropy and belief in how art enriches our lives on a daily basis. Her principle that art is not a luxury, but a necessity is what drives her support of the arts and those who create it. Locust Projects has been a fortunate beneficiary of Arison

and the Arison Arts Foundation for many years thanks to her vision and leadership.

Sarah Arison is President of Arison Arts Foundation, a private grant-making organization that supports emerging artists and the institutions that foster them. She was immersed in the arts from a young age by her grandparents, visionary philanthropists Ted and Lin Arison, who founded Arison Arts Foundation, YoungArts, and the New World Symphony, among their many philanthropic endeavors.

Arison is active across a broad cross-section of national arts organizations. She is President of the Board of the Museum of Modern Art, and Chair of the Board of YoungArts; she serves on the boards of MoMA PS1, American Ballet Theatre, The Kitchen and Aspen Art Museum; she is a trustee of Lincoln Center, New World Symphony and Serpentine Americas Foundation. Arison has also ventured into film producing, supporting projects that shed light on lesser-known aspects of the arts.

# CELEBRATING TARA LONG



Locust Projects celebrates

Tara Long, a Miami-Born and
based multidisciplinary artist
whose work spans performance,
installation, video, digital interactive
projects, software development,
and oil painting.

Rooted in her exploration of selfidentity as a response to early orphanhood trauma, Long creates various personas to magnify facets of her identity through which she navigates captivating narratives of resilience, mythology, transcendence, and connection.

Her work has been featured at the Museum of MOMA PS1, Pérez Art Museum Miami, Institute of Contemporary Art Miami, Oolite Arts, and Spinello Projects. As a musician and singer, she is also known for her avant-garde music project and alter-ego, Poorgrrrl, and longstanding contributions to the III Points Music Festival.

Long received her BFA from Parsons School of Design in New York in 2003 and her MFA from the University of Hartford. She is currently a resident artist at the Bakehouse Art Complex.

Long's Locust Projects exhibition, her first major solo show, was selected from 650 open call applications for the Main Gallery by a review panel including Juan Roselione-Valadez, Director of the Rubell Museum and past exhibiting artists Rafael Domenech (2023) and Rosario Marquardt of R+R (2000), overseen by co-founder Elizabeth Withstandley.

### ABOUT THE **EXHIBITION**

#### Tara Long:

I A FSQUINITA

As part of Locust Projects' commitment to supporting risk-taking and commissioning experimental new art and ideas, it has turned its space over—inside and out—to emerging Miamibased artist and performer, Tara Long, and her all-encompassing creative vision.

Part corner store, part surreal dream, LA ESQUINITA transforms Locust Projects into a sugarcoated parable about power, pleasure, and decay. From the building's colorful façade to the towering, crumbling cake inside, Miami-born artist Tara Long exposes the hidden costs of sweetness—how sugar built this place, drained its swamps, shapes our bodies, our appetites, and our myths.

Visitors move through three acts produced by the artist in collaboration with a community of artists, musicians, and performers: the seductive storefront of tempting confections; the collapsing "cake hall," where performance and sound unravel the fantasy; and the secret

speakeasy where nature, and truth, begin to return. What starts as a bodega, evolves into a stage, leading to a confession booth, and finally, a swamp reclaiming its ground.

Long's world fuses Miami's candy-colored surfaces with its buried histories, linking the exploitation of land to the conditioning of desire. LA ESQUINITA asks: when indulgence becomes survival, what does it cost to stay sweet?

LA ESQUINITA is commissioned by Locust Projects and curated by Lorie Mertes. It is made possible with support from Funding Arts Network.

Part of the *Made by Dusk* continuum, *UTU URU* explores modular systems of light and transformation. The gold surface acts as both mirror and membrane, shifting with each viewer's movement. Drawing from the Sumerian words for "sun" and "city," the work reflects an evolving dialogue between material form and the immaterial forces that animate it.

Through a process of layering and abstraction, Ri's brushless technique imbues each painting with a raw, tactile energy. The physical use of their hands and nails as well as their body in relation to the canvas imparts a visceral sensation or action – a caressing of the canvas, a scratching, or a longing for something felt within and outside the confines of the pictorial plane. De Profundis Clamavi ad Astra: Via ARKTVS, 2025 UVI ink on wood  $\mid$  24 x 20 inches framed Edition 1/25

A bear silhouette, representing ARKTVS, derived from Arcturus, the "protector of the bear" star, ascends toward the constellation of Ursa Major where the golden stars evoke the figure of the Mother Bear. Capturing the essence of a trilogy of videos, including De Profundis, it reflects an internal passage through the Mother | ocean | womb as a journey of transmutation toward spiritual liberation. The design is built from papers texturized with charcoal and acrylic paint, then photographed and digitally composed, a process he uses in his animated video installations.

Edison Peñafiel: De Profundis Clamavi ad Astra (From the Depths, I Cried Out to the Stars) opens at Locust Projects in November 2026 and has been awarded a VIA Art Fund Grant.
