COVID-19 has led to widespread unemployment and has put tenants in a difficult situation.

CARES Act extra unemployment benefit is set to expire on July 31, absent congressional

Mass evictions are expected nationwide. Some estimates show as many as 1 in 5 American

• As a short-term measure, the CARES Act, state governments, and local governing bodies have implemented temporary halts to evictions, however generally without rent relief.



EVICTIONS PROCESS IN FLORIDA

- Governed by Florida Residential Landlord and Tenant Act
- from a judge before evicting you
- No self help evictions! Without a court order, your landlord cannot:
 - Change the locks
 - Shut off utilities

• Remove your property

• Landlord must follow process, file a lawsuit in county court, and obtain an order



EVICTIONS PROCESS Common Reasons for Eviction

- Failure to pay rent
- Breach of lease agreement



Holding over after lease ends/failure to vacate (tenant can be liable for double rent)





EVICTIONS PROCESS

- Notice (time varies excludes weekends and holidays) \bullet
- File Complaint & Serve on Defendant \bullet
- Five days to respond excluding weekends and holidays
- If defending, must deposit rent with clerk \bullet
- Judgement
- Clerk issues writ of possession
- Eviction by sheriff





EVICTIONS PROCESS Defenses

- Notice was defective, but landlord given opportunity to cure
- Waiver by accepting rent with knowledge of non-compliance
- Amount of rent in the notice was incorrect motion to determine rent
- Eviction is retaliatory

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Landlord failed to maintain the property \bullet

FEDERAL - CARES Act

STATE - Governor and FL Supreme Court Orders





LOCAL - County, City, Courts



CARES ACT MORATORIUM

- rent or imposing fees, penalties, or charges for late payment of rent
- vacate within 30 days from notice
- Only applies to renters in "COVERED PROPERTIES"
- Does not apply to evictions filed before March 27, 2020 \bullet
- Moratorium period ends July 25, 2020



• CARES Act created a 120-day moratorium period preventing eviction of tenant for nonpayment of

Landlord may not issue notice to vacate until after the 120 days and cannot require tenant to



CARES ACT – Covered Properties

- Covered federal housing programs, such as HUD, VA, affordable housing, etc.
- Property has a federally backed mortgage loan or federally backed multifamily mortgage loan
- At least one tenant in the building has a Section 8 voucher

- Governor DeSantis' Emergency Order(s)
- Florida Supreme Court Order(s)





FLORIDA SUPREME COURT

- clerks of court issue writs of possession
- Order was extended several times but expired on June 30, 2020
- Once an evictions case reaches judgment, clerk may now issue writs of possession \bullet

GOVERNOR DESANTIS ORDER

- nonpayment of rent due to COVID-19
- Explicitly does not offer rent relief
- Extended several times, last two the day before it was set to expire
- Currently set to expire 12:01 am on August 1

On April 2, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-94 suspending residential evictions for



MIAMI-DADE COUNTY COURTS

- Act
- solely nonpayment
- Little other movement \bullet



Landlords are required to file an affidavit stating whether their property falls under the CARES

- Notice (time varies excludes weekends and holidays) lacksquare
- File Complaint & Serve on Defendant lacksquare

Governor DeSantis order prevents evictions for nonpayment

- Five days to respond excluding weekends and holidays
- If defending, must deposit rent with clerk lacksquare
 - No current movement on residential evictions for nonpayment
- Clerk issues writ of possession

Judgement

Eviction by sheriff MDPD not engaging in \bullet eviction activities



If CARES Act Property, can't serve notice

Clerk not issuing summons for nonpayment cases & MDPD not serving



Florida Housing Finance Corporation - Coronavirus Relief Fund

• Provided for in the CARES Act

- Governor DeSantis authorized \$120 Million to be administered through local State Housing Initiatives Partnership Program (SHIP)
- Available to assist with monthly rent, mortgage payments, and emergency repairs for costs between March 1 and December 30, 2020
- Income requirement of less than 120% area median income

Miami-Dade County Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

- County program providing one-time benefit for one month's rent (based on size of unit and monthly rent payment)
- Not receive other rental assistance (Section 8 voucher, public housing, VA, etc.) Documentation showing financial hardship from COVID

- Must earn no more than 80% of County Area Median Income • Deadline to apply is Friday, July 24 at 5 pm
