

We could not be more thrilled that you have joined us to celebrate Locust Projects' 25th Anniversary Year and to honor Dede Moss whose leadership matching grant challenge has supported our milestone move to the space we are gathered in tonight. It was Dede's longstanding vision and commitment to supporting artists that was the catalyst for our being able to secure a long term lease on this new space, propelling Locust into its next chapter, and we could not be more grateful.

We also give our thanks to tonight's Major Sponsors, the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation who, at our 20th anniversary dinner in 2018, announced a five-year, \$1 million grant that was instrumental in our growth. In the coming year, Locust Projects will add a Digital Innovation Lab funded by a \$750,000 Knight grant over three years helping to make our new home a laboratory for both physical and digital art, where artists from Miami and beyond can experiment with new media and technologies – a significant step in expanding our impact and opportunities we offer artists.

As a space that champions the realization of artists' ideas and the creative process, Rafael's Domenech's exhibition could not be the more perfect inaugural show. Invited to take over the space prior to final construction, Rafael has created a massive, pavilion-like setting intended as an active machine for production, exchange and dialogue. Rafael's project will evolve over the run of the show with tonight's interactive dining experience serving as a "Gesamtkunstwerk," or a work of art itself, in which you all are an essential component.

As we settle in for the night ahead I want to recognize the Event Cochairs who have helped make the evening a sold out success and to our Board of Directors for their commitment, vision and leadership. Thank you all for becoming part of our celebratory evening honoring Dede and kicking off our 25th Anniversary Year. With your continued support, we are excited to see where our story takes us next.





ABOUT THE HONOREE: DEDE MOSS

A longtime patron of the arts, Diane "Dede". Moss has served as the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Helena Rubinstein Foundation in New York City. She was committed to the Foundation's programs in education, the arts, and community services. Her special concern for the advancement of women and for the arts in education brought the Foundation to the forefront of these issues. Mrs. Moss participated in the President's Task Force on International Youth Exchanges at the White House and was inducted into the YMCA's Academy of Women Achievers.

She was a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater for eighteen years and formerly served as a Board member of Louise Wise Services and on the Executive committee of the Board of Directors of the Children's Blood Foundation at New York Hospital.

In addition to being a Locust Projects Board member, Dede presently serves on the Board of Pérez Art Museum Miami and is also a Board Member of Art in Public Places in Key Biscayne. Dede formerly served as a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Caramoor Center for Music and the Arts in Katonah, New York; the Board of Trustees of the Whitney Museum of American Art, where she was also formerly a member of the Education Committee; and on the Executive Committee of Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA) in North Miami.



ABOUT THE ARTIST: RAFAEL DOMENECH

Cuban-American artist Rafael Domenech is an interdisciplinary artist and educator exploring notions of architecture and urban design, public gathering spaces, and publishing methodologies. He refers to his works as "publications," and they take the form of pavilions, installations, and public programs, as well as experimental publications. Domenech's spatial interventions intersect publishing methodologies such as cutting, redacting, revising, and circulation as research tactics to amplify his interest in the exhibition model as an active machine for production rather than a repository space. Recent exhibitions include: the 58th Carnegie International, Carnegie Museum of Art, Pittsburgh; The Institute for Contemporary Art at Virginia Commonwealth University,

His work has been exhibited at SculptureCenter, New York; Socrates Sculpture Park, Long Island City; LIST Center, MIT, Cambridge; The Bass Museum, Miami Beach; Storefront for Art and Architecture, New York; Phillip and Patricia Frost Art Museum, Miami; Bronx Museum of the Arts, among others.

Richmond; Passerelle centre d'art contemporain, Brest, France; Museum

of Art and Design (MOAD), Miami.

He holds an MFA from Columbia University. In 2015, he received his BFA from New World School of the Arts and in 2009 received a BA from the Academia Nacional de Bellas Artes "San Alejandro" in Cuba. Born in 1989 in Havana, Rafael lives in New York City with his wife and two children and maintains deep ties to Miami.




