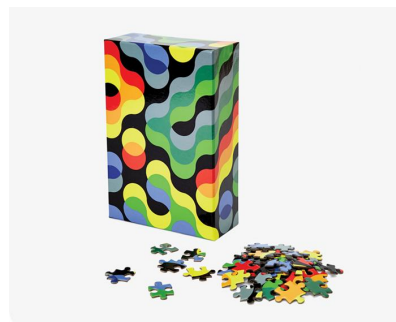

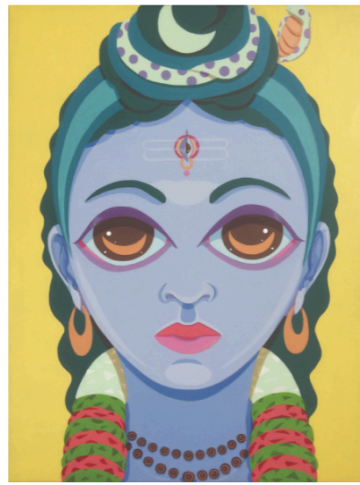

The *Bal Series* (2016) is an exploration of the artist as creator and the themes of birth, fertility, and new beginnings. It is a very personal series that reflects my own life experiences of becoming a father. Each of these paintings engages in this exploration through a practice found in many parts of Asia of painting deities as infants and children. This practice has centered on representations, or avatars, of gods and goddesses as children (“Bal”). It is a practice unique to the region and important to its culture. For this series, I’ve created a triptic representing three child-like representations of gods: *Bal Ganesh*—an avatar of the elephant god, god of new beginnings and remover of obstacles; *Bal Shiva*—an avatar of the god of creation and destruction; and *Teenage Minakshi*—an avatar of Parvati, the goddess of fertility. The stories of these child avatars often surround narratives of couples who were unable to bear children, who struggled with fertility, and reflect non-traditional births.



Ivan Toth Depeña

The Moment (Compiled Process), 2016

The Moment marks a new chapter in Ivan Toth Depeña ongoing series, *The Fallen Sky Chronicles*. In this series, the viewer is led through an alternate world, where a fateful misstep has caused a bending of time and space. At the center of Depeña's multi-media installation is a structure based on the archetype of a suburban house, which has been severed by an unknown force to reveal a light-filled, geode-like interior. The exhibition is accompanied by a mural on the side of the building consisting of a trigger image that springs to life when viewed through the smart phone app that Depeña developed with a team of software engineers. *The Moment* is a chapter in a citywide augmented reality custom mobile application project created by Depeña for Miami-Dade Art in Public Places.



Gonzalo Fuenmayor

Alibi, 2013

Gonzalo Fuenmayor was born in Barranquilla, Colombia in 1977. He received an MFA from School of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, MA in 2004, and a BFA in Fine Arts and Art Education from School of Visual Arts in 2000, where he was awarded a full tuition scholarship from the Keith Haring

Foundation. He has been awarded numerous awards including a 2015 South Florida Cultural Consortium Fellowship for Visual and Media Artists, Traveling Fellowship by the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston in 2014, first prize at the 6th Bidimensional Salon at Gilberto Alzate Avendaño Foundation in Bogotá, Colombia, 2013, and a Silas Rhodes Family Award in 2000. Fuenmayor has exhibited in numerous solo and group shows in USA, Latin America and Europe; his work was recently showcased in a solo exhibition "Tropical Mythologies" at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston in 2015, at the "Caribbean Crossroads" Exhibition at the Queens Museum, NY, "Florida Contemporary 2011" at the Naples Museum, as well as recent solo shows at Dolby Chadwick Gallery in San Francisco, CA and Gallery El Museo in Bogotá, Colombia in 2016. He currently lives and works in Miami, FL and is represented by Dot Fiftyone Gallery, Miami and Dolby Chadwick Gallery, San Francisco.



Martha Friedman *Knobs, 2015*

This edition was produced in conjunction with Martha Friedman's 2015 exhibition *Pore*. For her first major show in Miami, Friedman has created four vividly colored sheets of rubber – made by pouring around 1000lbs of the material onto Locust Projects' floor – that have been rigged to cascade from the rafters. Each site-specific sculpture has a costume attached and is colored to reference one of the four humors, the theory of which formed the basis of Western medicine for over two thousand years.

Liam Gillick *Horizon, 2010*

This edition was produced on the occasion of Locust Projects' launch of its first "Out of the Box" billboard project in December 2010 supported by a grant by the Knight Foundation. The *Horizon* edition is representative of Gillick's extensive graphic works derived from medieval woodcuts which have been an integral part of his practice since the early 1990s. The artist has produced a wide range of graphic material, including prints, posters, books, magazine covers and inserts, invitation cards (both for his own exhibitions and those of others), maps, logos and identities, both for public institutions and commercial art galleries.

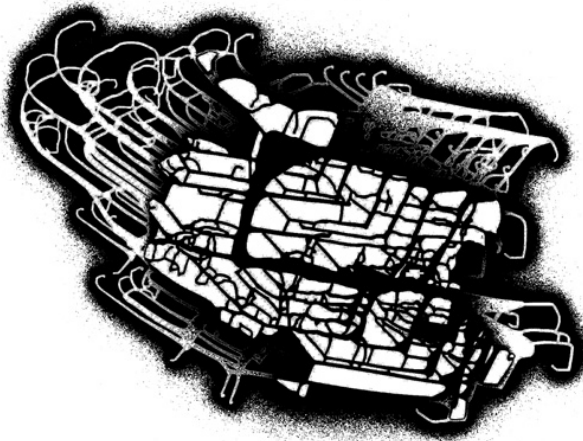


Kate Gilmore
By Any Means (Aftermath),
2009

This edition was produced in conjunction with Kate Gilmore's site-specific exhibition at Locust Projects by the same name in 2009.

"By Any Means," a performance-based video and a site-specific sculpture in which the physicality of architecture is pitted against the female body and will. Gilmore is the sole protagonist in her single-channel videos, where she sets up a difficult physical task to overcome. Her videos, always filmed in private, are destructive, comedic and

only attempted once. For "By Any Means," 2009, Gilmore, donned in feminine dress and heels, digs, builds and climbs her way out of a dirt-filled wooden sculpture. The large-scale sculpture is installed in Locust Projects' adjacent courtyard and will remain on view for the duration of the exhibition.



Felice Grodin
YT-1300 492727, 2014

Felice Grodin, born in Bologna, Italy, currently lives and works in Miami Beach. She obtained her Bachelor of Architecture from Tulane University and her Master of Architecture with Distinction from Harvard University. Her explorations in alternative landscapes have been exhibited in Cartographies, Lost Horizon and nolo contendere at Diana Lowenstein

Gallery. Her work has been featured at the Tampa Museum of Art, Manifest Research Gallery and Drawing Center in Cincinnati, Florida State University Museum of Fine Arts in Tallahassee, the Center on Contemporary Art in Seattle, Dimensions Variable in Miami and Girls' Club in Ft. Lauderdale.



Adler Guerrier
Untitled (ag-cbcsa), 2013

Adler Guerrier (b. 1975) creates visual dialogue between a wunderkammer of materials and techniques. He improvises between form and function to nimbly subvert space and time in constructions of race, ethnicity, class, and culture. Adler calls upon the democratizing nature of collage and the authority of formal composition to designate to art history an axis of contemporary identity critique. Often chronicling the hybridity and juxtaposition in his immediate environs, he practices a contemporary flaneurie in an impending age of post-demography.



Drew Heitzler
Untitled (Scarface X), 2010

Untitled was produced in conjunction with Los Angeles-based artist and filmmaker Drew Heitzler. Heitzler's 2010 installation that focused on a two-channel video projection that explores the 1932 film Scarface. Before Brian DePalma's Miami-based remake was released in 1983, an original version of Scarface, directed by Howard Hawkes and produced by Howard Hughes, was produced in Los Angeles. For the exhibition, Heitzler edited Hawkes' film to exclude dialog and create an abstract narrative that shifted the focus from drug and street crime to white-collar crime and government complicity.

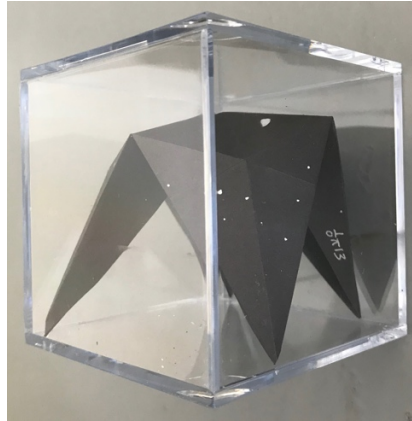
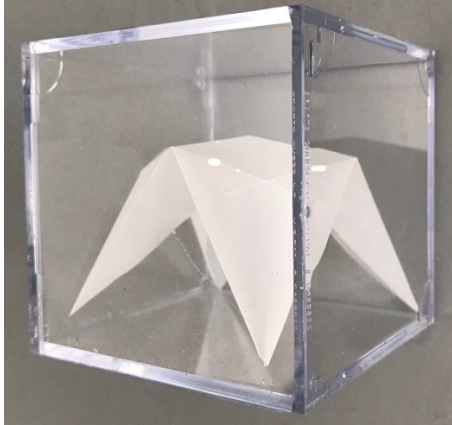

Jillian Mayer

Homemade Laptop Case (Pink), 2013

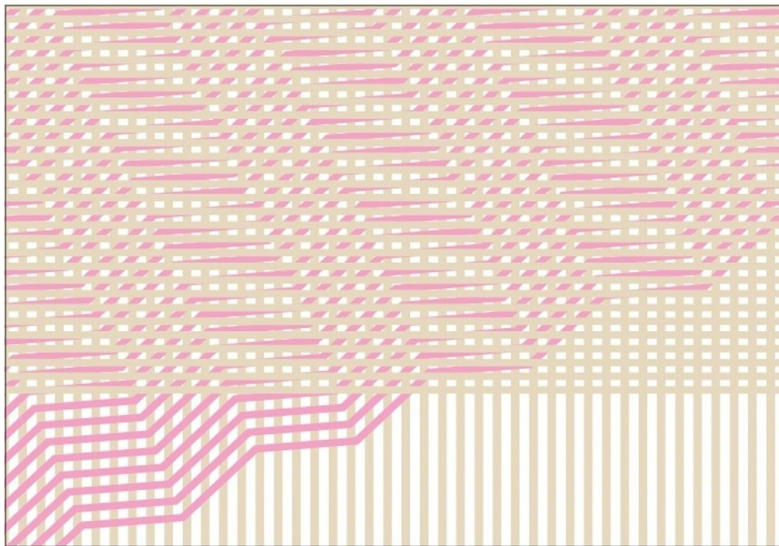
Homemade Laptop Case was produced in conjunction with Mayer's 2013 exhibition *Precipice/PostModem*, which featured sculptural and installation work satirically exploring the concept of a technological singularity, the theoretical moment in time when the boundary between human and machine no longer

exists. Mayer uses comedy as a means to inspire introspection about technology's place as a surrogate for spirituality in our lives, and implies that it is quickly becoming much more, regardless of whether or not the predictions of futurists like Ray Kurzweil come to fruition. The various pieces of her show explore the ramifications of this impending change, from angles that range from sociological to parodic to sublime.



Phillip Smith *Balance, 2015*

The curious and psychologically-charged images in Smith's new works are drawn from found imagery in 1950s Cold War spy manuals, lingerie ads, books on mysticism and numerology, lost magic books and early genetic diagrams. Smith works the canvas like a physicist's blackboard where he can postulate new image formulations and equations. The paintings are characterized by slightly visible erased imagery that serves as both memory and ghost-like images reminiscent of Smith's childhood that was filled with séances and talking spirits. The result is a disorienting universe characteristic of Smith's long association with both pop culture and metaphysical practices.

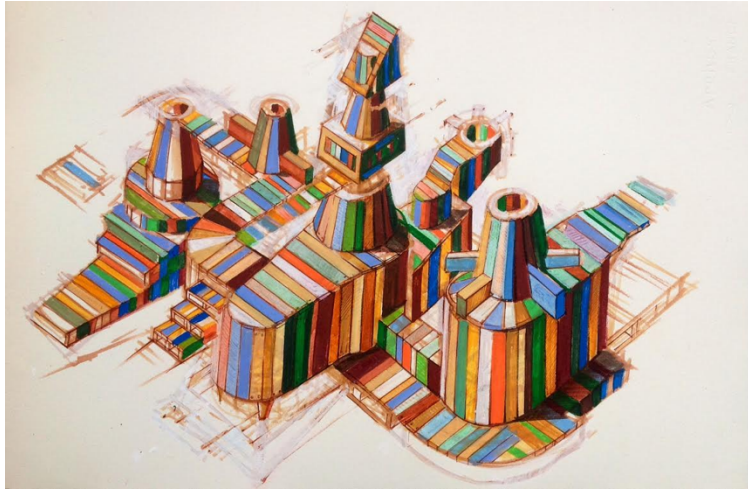


Frances Trombly *Twill, 2014*

In the last few years, Trombly's work has become more reductive. Removing the object yet staying consistent with the material. The focus has changed to the cloth itself. The purity of making and the recording of process through time, along the way revealing the imperfections of the hand. The cloth itself becomes a timeline—a transcript of the movements of

working and constructing in space.

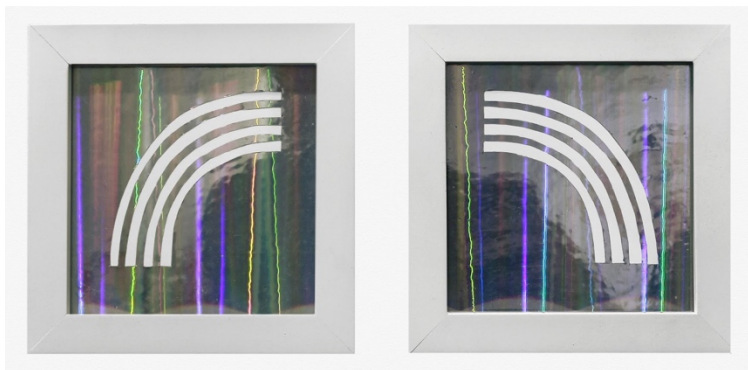
In this print design Trombly uses the printing process in the same way that she produces her sculptural fabric works. The patterning of horizontal and vertical lines are similar to the layering that develops in a weaving. These lines expose the printing process revealing each layer printed. Yet, keeping an overlap where a twill is created. The artist's hope is that the print is an emphasis on process, production and the making.



Simón Vega *Crom@crópolis, 2014*

Crom@crópolis was produced in conjunction with Vega's exhibition "Sub-tropical Social Sculptures" on view at Locust Projects from November 15, 2014-January 2015. The exhibition consisted of a series of happenings using basic, simple structures devised for social interaction. Drawing from Joseph Beuys's Social Sculpture concept but with a sub-tropical, Miami twist to them, the

happenings highlight elements essential to, but seldom brought forth in the production of art, such as friendship, humor, collaboration, generosity, improvisation and the temporary nature of relationships. These happenings are inspired in social, fun, side-tracked and non-commercial events that organically happen in the city of Miami, such as BBQs, bonfires, etc. The structures designed for these experimental gatherings were then used in a sculptural installation at Locust Projects' Project Room.



Agustina Woodgate *1111, 2011*

Conceived specifically for Locust Projects, 1111 is the latest from a series of displaced landscapes that create surreal inversions of exterior and interior spaces.

Woodgate creates art that fosters interpersonal dialogue, from which meaning collectively emerges. Through a broad range of disciplines—including sculpture, installation, performance and collaboration—the artist's work focuses on the relationship between individuals and their environment, and explores layers of physical and psychological space.

Agustina Woodgate has most recently been selected to participate in the 2019 Whitney Biennial.
